BRSP at a glance

Balochistan Rural Support Program (BRSP) is an autonomous not-for-profit organization working in the rural areas of Balochistan. BRSP's history goes back to the project "Pak-German self help initiative" that was initiated in 1983 in collaboration with Government of Germany and Pakistan. The overall mission of BRSP is to facilitate the establishment and improvement of sustainable livelihoods of the rural poor in Balochistan. This is accomplished through the mobilization of poor communities to help them plan and implement their own development agenda.

BIHD-An Overview

Balochistan Institute of Human Development (BIHD) has been initiated to accomplish BRSP's mission of "Harnessing peoples' potential to help themselves" for poverty alleviation. Human Resource Development is main the core thrusts of BRSP for achieving sustainable socio-economic development. BIHD makes the integrated use of trainings, organizational development, and career development efforts to improve individual, group, and organizational effectiveness. Aiming to reduce poverty of rural poor through a variety of approaches where one of them is building the capacity of professionals and communities through an intensive capacity building program.

BIHD facilitates and provides social guidance through formal trainings, social enterprise concepts, researches, on the job trainings, case studies, stimulations, on and off job technical advices and experience sharing forums both for staff and community members of BRSP, partner organizations, and for national and international organizations and networks.

- A dinner was hosted by BRSP in the honor of PPAF and World Bank mission led by Mr. Qazi Azmat Essa on 27th May 2008;
- Nutrition project funded by UNICEF has been formally initiated in three districts i.e. Nushki, Kharan and Khuzdar;
- Regional Program Officers (RPOs) of Pishin, Killa Saifullah, Mastung, and Kalat attended a week long 12-18 May core competencies course at Institute of Rural Management (IRM);

Community Livestock Practitioners

In the month of May, the 4th training session of CLEWs was successfully completed on 26th May 2008. This month long training session was held at CASVAB where 31 CLEWs from 4 districts i.e. Pishin, Qilla Saifullah, Kalat and Mastung. 9 women from district Mastung also passed out which is a great achievement and first of its kind in Balochistan. Centre for Advanced Studies vaccinology and biotechnology (CASVAB) is a semi Govt. body under the auspices of University of Balochistan. The certification ceremony of CLEWs was gracefully held on 26 May, at CASVAB office where Secretary Livestock honoured the event as a Chief Guest. He complimented the efforts and dedication of CLEWs and encouraged them to go back to their communities with inspiration and enhanced commitment.

Community Livestock Extension Workers (CLEWs) is a group of community activists identified at the community level by the community organization.

Clinic Assistants Training

Mandated to organize professional development trainings, BIHD organized a 10 day capacity building training for the clinic assistants of 5 districts from 1-11 May 2008. The training primarily trained them in clinic management, record keeping, inventory of medicines and basic livestock services.

BRSP is operating 42 livestock clinics in five districts of Balochistan i.e. Mastung, Kalat, Killa Saifullah, Zhob and Pishin under the project "Prime Minister Special Initiative for Livestock" that aims to increase livestock productivity in rural areas of Balochistan.

Community Management Skills Training

BRSP conducted two CMSTs in Zhob and Killa Saifullah for women and men comprising participants 10 women (Zhob) from 14-16 May and 15 men of Killa Saifullah from 16-19 May 2008. Community Management Skills Training (CMST) is a community based training that is organized for the office bearers of community organizations including president and managers. The training mainly contains BRSP's introduction and background, planning development activities and its approaches, savings, management of community organization and role of women in community development.

Enterprise development

BIHD exhibited various indigenous handicrafts of artisans in a workshop of Family Advancement for Life and Health (FALAH) on May 22, 2008.

AHAN (Aik HUNar, Aik Nagar) project of enterprise is in its production phase after successful completion of training phase. There are 50 women artisans engaged in district Mastung where they are working on Balochi embroidery. Similarly, BIHD also conducted an orientation on enterprise development for female Social Organizers of Muslim Bagh region.

Enterprise development program of BIHD is one of the key interventions that BRSP heavily depends on to achieve its goal.

Women and Livestock

BIHD facilitated 87 events for female livestock farmers where 2050 community women participated from five districts including Killa Saifullah, Pishin, Kalat, Mastung and Zhob.

Female Livestock Farmers are community women that manage livestock at domestic level. BIHD conducts one day orientation events at the community level they are sensitized about animals' treatment and care, diseases and their symptoms as well as the precautionary measures to avoid diseases. The training is conducted by internal human resource of BIHD.
